MidAmerican Energy customers in Iowa are eligible to purchase trees for \$25 each (with the remaining cost funded through a grant from MidAmerican Energy). Tree purchase is initially limited to two trees per household to ensure all customers have an opportunity to purchase trees. Advanced purchase is recommended. In the event additional trees are available on distribution day, they will be released for purchase at 4:30 p.m. on a first-come, first-served basis, or until all trees are sold. Trees **must** be picked up Thursday, May 14, 2009, between 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. at West Lake Park, 14910 110th Ave., Davenport. Any trees not picked up by 6:30 p.m. on distribution day will be considered a donation to the Scott County Conservation Board. **Trees are nonrefundable. Exchanges will not be accepted and plant material is under no warranty and/or guarantee.**

Please consider the size at maturity when selecting the right tree for your site. Remember to call Iowa One Call at 800-292-8989 or 811 to check for utilities at least 48 hours prior to digging.**

- Bur oak (can be 80' tall; 90' wide)
- Red oak (can be 80 feet tall; 65' wide)
- Burgundy Belle red maple (can be 50' tall; 50' wide)
- Thornless honeylocust (can be 80' tall; 70' wide)
- Serbian spruce (can be 50' tall; 25' wide)

### **TREE DESCRIPTIONS - 2009**

Bur Oak – Native to Iowa, this tree reaches 60-80' height with 60-90' spread at maturity. Adaptable to most soils, requires full sun. Yellow-brown to purple fall color, excellent wildlife food source.

Red Oak – A native tall shade tree, it is a moderate growing tree reaching 60-80' height with 45-65' spread at maturity. Does best on sunny sites. Great for wildlife and has bright reddish or golden brown fall color.

Burgundy Belle Red Maple – 45' height and 35' spread at maturity, medium to fast rate of growth. Tolerates partial shade and a variety of sites. Red to burgundy fall color with compact, oval-rounded crown.

Thornless Honeylocust – A vigorous grower, reaches 60-70' height and 50-60' spread at maturity. Adaptable to most soils, prefers full sun. Yellow-green fall color, tolerates difficult urban conditions.

Serbian Spruce - Evergreen that grows to 50' tall and 25' spread. Medium growth rate on well drained sites. Grows well in full sun. Pyramidal shape. Light green to blue green needles with purple to cinnamon colored 1 ½" cones. Thin arching branches with a slender straight trunk.
