Conference Description

Participants in this full day event, will gain insight from experts in the field as they discuss lessons learned from actual events and response efforts. Presentations will provide firsthand information to first responders, support agencies, businesses and non-profits, community partners, and elected officials who will be

responding, managing and recovering from a large scale disaster. This program is a collaboration of the Iowa Region 5A Health Care Coalition, Rock Island & Scott County Emergency Management Agencies, Rock Island & Scott County Health Departments, Genesis Health System, UnityPoint Health-Trinity, US Army

Garrison Rock Island Arsenal, American Red Cross, Rock Island County Medical Reserve Corps, Community Foundations of the Great River Bend, Scott County Emergency Communication Center, and Eastern Iowa Community Colleges.



Learning Objectives

By the end of the program, participants should be able to:

1. Build community partnerships to support health preparedness, and be integrated into the jurisdictions' all-hazards emergency plans;
2. Identify and engage community partners in response to foster public health, medical and mental/behavioral health, in a community before, during, and after an incident;
3. Identify and engage community partners in response to foster resource development in a community before, during, and after an incident;
4. Determine risks to the

- health of the jurisdiction by identifying potential hazards, vulnerabilities, and risks in the community infrastructure;
5. Increase their knowledge and ability to work collaboratively to prepare for, withstand, and recover from public health incidents;
6. Coordinate training or guidance to ensure community engagement in preparedness efforts;
7. Develop, coordinate and disseminate information, alerts, warnings and notifications specific to incident type;
8. Notify and assemble key public information personnel to provide information to the public during and after an inci-

- dent;
9. Identify businesses and not-for profit agencies whom serve the community, including vulnerable populations, and work together to plan, respond, and recover from disasters;
10. Recognize how the heroin pandemic affects and requires the assistance of an entire community;
11. Discover avenues for immediate and sustainable treatment and recovery;
12. Have a better understanding that workplace violence is a real threat and how this viable threat impacts the safety and security of staff and facilities;
13. Identify a mass fatality incident and the key components of mass fatality incident management



Keynote: Tim Ryan



From Dope to
Hope

A tireless advocate for long-term recovery, Tim Ryan is no stranger to addiction – including heroin, cocaine, and alcohol. Despite a successful business career, Tim found himself in the grips of heroin and, ultimately, was sentenced to seven years in prison for a number of drug-related convictions. Tim got clean and sober behind bars and was released in just 14 months.

Six months after his release, tragedy struck. His 20-year-old son, Nick – for whom Tim had paved the way to use deadly drugs – died tragically from an overdose. Attempting to get beyond the devastation and

heartbreak, Tim used Nick’s death as the inspiration to spread a message of hope and recovery to others, believing that *if even one addict or one family could be spared the horrors of the disease of addiction*, he would be making a difference. As a result, he founded **A Man in Recovery Foundation**, a phenomenally successful 501c3 nonprofit that’s sole purpose is to facilitate free or reduced-cost recovery services to addicts and their families.

Today, in addition to running addiction recovery groups for addicts and families, Tim Ryan is the subject of the new **A&E** documentary, [Dope Man](#),

reaching millions. He has been a featured thought leader in numerous national media, including *USA Today*, [Newsweek](#), [Chicago Tribune](#), and “The Steve Harvey Show with Dr. Drew,” and dozens of nationally syndicated radio shows. He was an invited guest by the U.S. President to the 2016 State of the Union Address. He is the author of the bestselling book, [From Dope to Hope](#). He is the National Outreach Director for Transformations Drug and Alcohol Treatment Center. Tim frequently speaks to [schools](#), healthcare providers, municipalities, community groups, corporations, and others who care to hear his message.

Frank DeAngelis has been a staff member at Columbine High School in the Jeffco School District of Littleton, Colorado since 1979. Frank became principal in 1996 and retired in June of 2014 after 35 years at Columbine High School.

In April of 1999, Frank was faced with the unthinkable that redefined our country's way of thinking about "active shooter" violence in our schools and how police and staff respond to such threat. The tragic Columbine shooting took 13 inno-

cent lives and injured several more. Faced with the worst, Frank continued to battle through the emotions, challenges, and day to day struggles and continued to be the principal at Columbine until the students who were in the Columbine elementary schools at the time of the shooting graduated.

Due to his strong leadership, bond formed with the community, passion for his job and ability to move forward, Frank has been called upon to speak

nationally about the effects of a school tragedy at a variety of conferences and has been a consultant after a number of violent school incidents. Frank now serves as a consultant for safety and emergency management for the Jeffco School District in Colorado and continues to deliver his powerful message at speaking engagements nationwide. Frank is a proven leader, powerful speaker and a firm supporter of the Guard911 services.


